CALDARA: Kyrie a8 in A minor

This edition is based on an autograph score in the Oesterreichische Nationalbibliothek (A-Wn SA.67.B.100/1), where it forms part of the Kiesewetter Collection. It is headed: "Chirie à 8, con Strom:" à 9 Xbe 1705" (Kyrie for eight voices with instruments, [begun] on 9th December 1705); at the end of the score, the composer wrote "Finis a 14 Xbre 1705 M:" (completed [in Mantua, where he had been maestro di cappella to Duke Charles IV since 1699] on 14 December 1705). It is written on paper rastered with 16 staves; the top and bottom staves are left empty in the outer movements, while the central Christe section (which has no separate line for the bass of the string group, and which reduces the number of vocal parts to four) leaves two staves blank at the top of each page and four at the foot.

The edition uses the modern Greek spelling "Kyrie"; performers must decide whether or not Caldara's orthography affects what they sing. There is an unintelligible word to the left of the vocal staves for that movement which may have indicated that it is to be sung by soloists; he wrote "Segue Tutti" at the end of the movement, so that is a plausible suggestion. As there are no indications of the instrumentation the part-names follow the clefs: G2G2C3C4F4 CIC3C4F4 CIC3C4F4 and F4. Although the bass instrument in the string group is labelled "Violoncello" in the edition, a bassoon might equally well play that part.
